

Animal farming skills for learners with deafblindness

The learner will know different animals that can be reared, understand the procedures to follow when rearing animals and apply animal farming skills to engage himself/herself in income generating activities.

Interventions

- Introducing the learner to animals
- Guiding the learner to identify animals to rear
- Introducing tools, materials and equipment to the learner
- Guide the learner to manipulate tools, materials and equipment
- Demonstrating various animal rearing activities to the learner
- Guiding the learner to develop routines in carrying out animal rearing activities
- Organising farm visits for the learners
- Attending field days/ exhibitions with learner
- Supporting the learner to collect animal products
- Supporting the learner to store and sell animal products
- Supporting the learner to store tools and equipment
- Guiding the learner in keeping farm records
- Reinforcing learner's achievements and positive behaviours
- Observing and recording achievements and progress
- Contacting veterinary doctors

Achievement Indicators

The learner can:

- rear animals.
- follow routines in carrying out animal rearing activities.
- earn income from animal products.
- participate in improve income levels.

Resources/Materials

Real animals, egg trays, feeding troughs, drinkers, ropes, water, wheelbarrow, spade, sacks, milking cans, object of reference, calendar system, manure, animal shade, animal feeds, sprayers, acaricides, etc.
