The Persons with Disabilities Act, 2025 plays a vital role in protecting the rights and meeting the needs of persons with disabilities in Kenya. Knowing these rights—and how to access support—helps ensure full participation, inclusion, and dignity for all



Equal Rights PWDs have the same freedoms as everyone else and must be treated with dignity and respect.





Family Life PWDs can marry, raise families, and must not be separated from their children unless ordered by a court for the child's best interest.





Protection from Abuse No violence, abuse, or forced medical procedures without consent.



Fair Employment PWDs must get equal job opportunities, support, and promotion; 5% of public/private jobs must go to them.



Accessible Health Services PWDs are entitled to affordable, respectful healthcare and rehabilitation.




Justice Access Police and courts must provide interpreters and fair access to justice. Access to Information Services and public info must be accessible—e.g., in Braille, sign language, or large print.



Accessible Buildings Public spaces must have ramps, accessible toilets, signage, and parking.



Political Participation PWDs have the right to vote, lead, and be involved in all decision-making spaces. Inclusive Education Schools must admit PWDs and provide support like ramps, Braille, and sign language.



Transport Access PWDs must not be overcharged or denied public transport.



Support Services Government must offer support services and inform families and communities.
